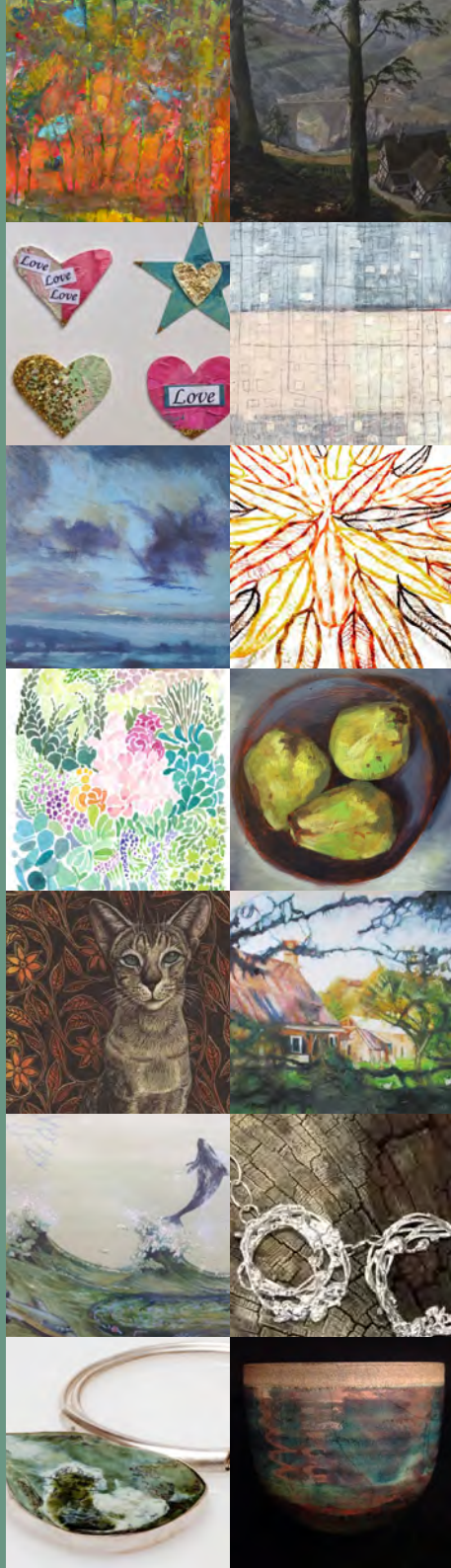

Welcome to the 2019 Art Trail

In its third year, the 2019 Combe Down Art Trail is set to be an exciting weekend! With over 45 artists in 15 venues around Combe Down, it takes place on Saturday 7th and Sunday 8th September, 10am to 5pm. This free event includes workshops, demonstrations and activities, as well as plenty of locally-made artwork, jewellery, photography, print-work, sculpture, craft and ceramics for sale.

Leading you through the heart of this beautiful village, the Art Trail is marked with arrows and red paper lanterns. You'll have the opportunity to visit artists' homes and studios as well as local landmarks, such as The Museum of Bath Stone.

On the Art Trail this year,

there are animation workshops, flower crown making, music workshops and a children's writing competition. Many artists will be demonstrating their particular skills, such as clay throwing, and have their sketchbooks available for you to get an insight into their process.

You can reach Combe Down via buses 2 and 3, which both run regularly from Bath Bus Station and stop at the Hub, venue 1. Alternatively, there will be some parking available around the village. Please remember to bring cash or your cheque-book as only some of the artists have mobile banking. The nearest cashpoint is at venue 11, the Co-op on the Avenue.

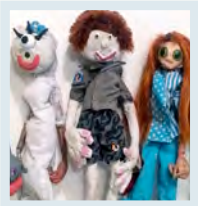

Sara is a linocut artist and printmaker, working mainly in monochrome. She is inspired by the world around her, from nature, travel, and architecture to films and TV programmes.

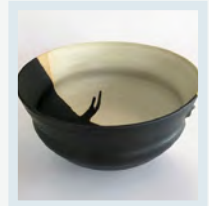

Venue 3 has six artists showcasing a variety of work in different mediums. Weather-permitting, ceramicist Kate Marshall will be running demonstrations on the wheel.

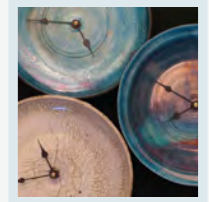

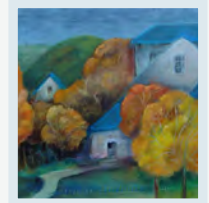

Sally's paintings this year are in acrylic, water-mixable oils or on glass. Her work is often experimental as well as the more traditional landscapes and still life.

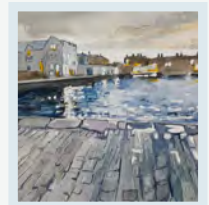

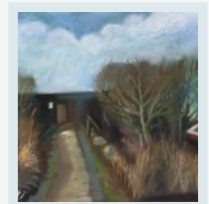

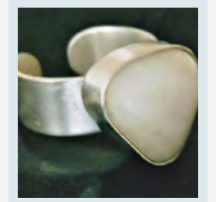
Emma makes silver jewellery that is light, elegant and distinctive. She tries to recycle or upcycle materials as much as possible, making new things from old.

Bridget Baker Wirework

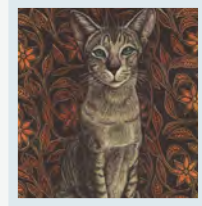
